BSCI-system: Special attention must be directed towards subcontractors who also shall fulfil the social requirements. This should be evident by "Social Audit Report".

Control Union Fair Choice: For composite products make sure that at least 96% of ingredients will be covered.

---

ETI Base Code: An estimation of quality of the audit needs to be performed for each particular case. Special attention must be directed towards subcontractors who also shall fulfil the social requirements.

GLOBALGAP Risk Assessment on Social Practices (GRASP) V1.2 Jan 09 English version: The system is developed for farms and it is important to check that the requirements are met in all parts of the production chain. For multi-ingredient products you have to check that all ingredients are covered.

Fair Trade Sustainability Alliance (FairTSA), Consolidated Standards for the production of Agricultural Products, Processed Foods, Wild Collected Plants, Handicraft and Personal Care Products. Date: December 18, 2009, version: 2.50: For multiple ingredient products the standard allows that 50 percent of the ingredients are not certified according to programmes fulfilling KRAV standard 2.13. This means that the importer needs to obtain additional information on such products, stating the status of each ingredient.
