



Recognized certifications which fulfill KRAV's Extra Requirements for Animal Products

KRAV's extra requirements for animal products are met by production certified according to the Standards below. You find the extra requirements in section 16.8 of KRAV's Standards 2019-20.

Eggs and Egg Products

- Soil Association Organic Standards 2018 (version 17.6)

Pork

- Soil Association Organic Standards 2018 (version 17.6)

Poultry Meat

- Soil Association Organic Standards 2018 (version 17.6)

For "Dairy", "Beef" and "Sheep and Goat Meat" there are no recognized standards.

Not recognized Standards from 2019

Standards that previously have been recognized.

KRAV-certified companies, which initiated a transaction for importation or bringing in of products based on recognized standards in 2018 or earlier, can continue to import or bring in these products produced during 2018 from the same supplier. For products not previously KRAV-certified and products imported or brought in via new suppliers, the actual list of Recognized Standards and Systems for Supplier Evaluation applies.

Dairy Products

- ICEA - DTR 14 - Organic Livestock (IOS v3)

Motivation: It is possible to be certified to the ICEA standard, even if the livestock do not have any access to pasture during the growing season, which is not consistent with the extra requirements in the KRAV standards.

Evaluated but not recognized Standards for Animal Products

Soil Association Organic Standards 2018 (version 17.4) for Dairy Products, Beef, Sheep and Goat Meat

Motivation: Most extra requirements are not fulfilled. Of four or five points in the extra requirements for each of these kinds of animal products, only the one regarding access to pasture is fulfilled.

Naturland Standard 6/2018



Version 2019-03-04

Motivation: Naturland Standards do not fulfill the extra requirement for the minimum withdrawal period of two days for veterinary medicinal treatments that apply to all animal products. The requirements of feed produced on the keeper's farm is not fulfilled either. The standards for mutilation, including analgesia, is not fully consistent with the KRAV-standards.

BioSuisse Standards (1.1. 2018)

Motivation: BioSuisse Standards do not fulfill the extra requirement for the minimum withdrawal period of two days for veterinary medicinal treatments that apply to all animal products. The requirements of feed produced on the keeper's farm is not fulfilled either. The standards for mutilation, including analgesia, is not fully consistent with the KRAV-standards.
